

Cheshire Oaks Designer Outlet

Cheshire Oaks Designer Outlet is the UK's largest designer outlet.

Located just off junction 10 of the M53 near Ellesmere Port, the designer outlet has first-class road and rail links. Scheduled bus services regularly operate between the centre and nearby Ellesmere Port and Chester train stations. There are also dedicated bus services from Chester Town Hall and Ellesmere Port Bus Stations.

Attractions close to the centre include the neighbouring Coliseum retail and leisure park, Chester Zoo and the Blue Planet Aquarium, Britain's largest aquarium attraction.

Covering 1,859,180 square feet, the Cheshire Oaks site is big enough to house 20 football pitches. It has 140 stores, including Gap Outlet, Marks & Spencer Outlet, Calvin Klein Jeans, Burberry, Pringle, Coast, adidas and Oasis.

Since opening in 1995, more than 55 million people have visited Cheshire Oaks and over 6.5 million people shop at the centre each year.

Centre facilities include:

- Spacious foodcourt with outlets including McDonald's, Harry Ramsden's and Villa Pizza plus restaurants and cafes including Shere Khan, Starbucks and Costa Coffee
- Two safety-approved children's play areas
- Two customer information desks, one offering tourist information
- Over 3,000 free car parking spaces

The centre is open 364 days a year, including Bank Holidays (10am – 6pm), from 10am-8pm Monday to Friday, 10am - 7pm Saturday and 10am - 5pm Sunday (*larger stores open at 11am)

- Since the centre opened in 1995, it's welcomed over 55 million visitors - that's more than the population of Australia!
- Shoppers who walk past every shop at Cheshire Oaks will cover over one mile in distance.
